Chronic Absenteeism Plan:

The district Chronic Absenteeism goal is not to exceed 28.2%, currently, we are at 28%.

- The District has identified focus schools and is meeting with their teams to create/strengthen their Chronic Absenteeism Prevention Plan.
- Our current focus is on preventing additional students from becoming chronically absent, with a laser focus on students with 10-17 absences.
- Chronic Absenteeism Prevention Plans were created by each school
