This work includes projects such as: masonry repair, window and roof replacement, HVAC systems, new fire alarm systems, public address systems, electrical upgrades, repairing major plumbing issues, removal of TCUs and playground rehabilitation. DOE's Division for School Facilities (DSF), which include school custodial engineers, plant managers, facility directors, and DSF central staff, is responsible for day-to-day maintenance and repair of school buildings. Operational Updates (Health updates - Immunization and COVID):

<u>Immunization:</u> All students attending school must be fully vaccinated against specific preventable diseases as identified in the 2022–23 school immunization requirements. Students who are not fully immunized have/will receive a DOE 'warning letter', together with the list of immunization requirements, and may be excluded from school.

<u>Masks</u>: Based on the recommendation of our partners at DOHMH, we are encouraging every student and staff member to mask up as we head into the winter season. All schools and offices are equipped with masks. As a reminder, masks should cover the nose and the mouth, resting snugly above the nose, below the mouth, and on the sides of the face. We also continue to encourage everyone to stay up-to-date with all vaccinations, including flu and COVID.
